Pediculosis capitis (PC), or head lice infestation, is a global condition primarily affecting school-aged children, especially girls. Spread through direct contact or sharing personal items, PC is not linked to poor hygiene. Lice go through three life stages: egg, nymph, and adult, with females laying nits close to the scalp for warmth. Symptoms include severe itching, rash, and secondary infections from scratching, sometimes leading to lymphadenopathy and iron deficiency anemia. PC can cause social stigma, psychological distress, and missed school or work due to discomfort and embarrassment

CASE PROFILE

A 45-year-old female, with no history of diabetes, hypertension, or thyroid disorder, presented with complaints of severe itching and thick crust formation on the scalp for the past six months. Her scalp is heavily infested with lice and nits, with itching worsening at night and during perspiration. Excessive scratching has led to excoriations and ulcerations, causing bleeding when crusts are removed. She experiences a bloody odor from the scalp when showering, along with burning pain, generalized itching (pediculid), disturbed sleep, fever, malaise, and cervical lymphadenopathy.

Examination

Scalp: Excoriated and ulcerated with sticky, offensive discharge. Nits: Numerous, firmly attached to hair shafts in frontal and vertex areas.
